

# Powder River Interpretive Trail

## Wallowa-Whitman National Forest



*Located below Mason Dam (Phillips Reservoir) this accessible trail runs along the Powder River between the lower interpretive area and the small upper picnic site. The trails are popular for family hiking, fishing, bird watching and picnics.*

**Total Miles:** 0.6 accessible miles, and 0.6 non-accessible miles for disabled users

**Difficulty level:** Easy

**Accessibility:** The northern section along Highway 7 is paved and accessible. There are also 2 accessible fishing areas/deck by the river. The southern sections across the river bridges and to the island, are narrow earthen non-accessible trails.

**Facilities and Attractions:** Open yearlong; Restrooms in upper parking picnic area open in summer months; Interpretive signs for local fish and wildlife are located along the Powder River in the lower area; No parking fees or permits.

**Directions:** From Baker City, travel south on Highway 7 for *about* 15 miles. The lower recreation site is located on the left side (south) of Highway 7. The entrance for the upper accessible picnic site is located about another  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile on the road going below the dam. The trail goes between both the upper and lower sites.
